MLA

- Used mostly for writing papers in the English and other Humanities fields.
- References in-text are briefly identified with the use of parenthesis.
 - Use the author's surname followed by the exact page number where material was found.
 - For citing multiple authors in-text, list all surnames.
 - For similar surnames, use initial of the first name.
- A full documentation appears in a Works Cited section at the end of the document.
 - Includes each source that you have paraphrased or cited.
 - Entries listed alphabetically according to author's surname.
 - For multiple authors:
 - Less than four – list all in alphabetical order
 - Four or more – list the first author followed by et al.

Periodicals

[Last Name, First Name]. "[Title of Article]." *[Title of Periodical]* [Volume Number] [Date Published (Day, Month, Year)]: [Page Numbers of Article]. [Type of Medium].

Journals

[Last Name, First Name]. "[Title of Article]." *[Title of Journal]* [Volume and Issue Number (#.#)] [Date Published (Day, Month, Year)]: [Page numbers of Article]. [Type of Medium]. [Date Accessed (If Online)]
